- On average, women earned only **78 cents** for every dollar earned by men in 2007.
- Women 65 and older are nearly **twice as likely** as men in this age group **to be poor** or near poor (20 percent vs. 12 percent); median household income for women is a little more than half that of men in this age group.
- Women hold just **17 percent** of the seats in the U.S. Congress, including 17 of the 100 seats in the Senate and 74 of the 435 seats in the House of Representatives.
- **Only six** U.S. state governors (12 percent) are women.

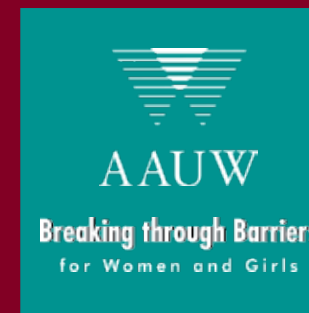

AAUW is a nationwide, nonpartisan community that uses its influential network to disseminate information, raise awareness, and effect change on women's issues.

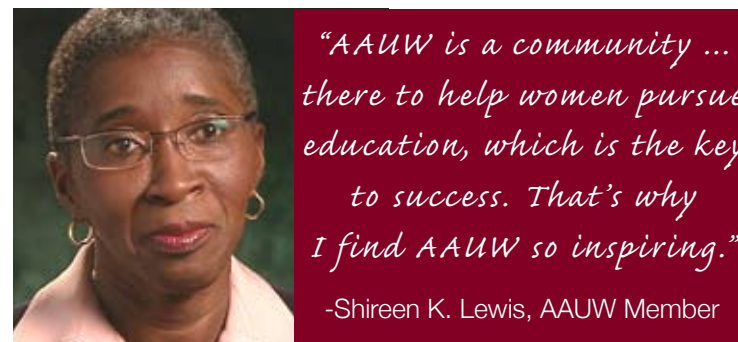
- Thanks to the hard work of AAUW Action Network members and our coalition partners, the U.S. House and Senate passed the Lilly Ledbetter Fair Pay Act; President Obama signed the bill into law on January 29, 2009.
- AAUW provides more than \$3 million each year in fellowships and grants to outstanding women and nonprofit organizations.
- Our Legal Advocacy Fund supports plaintiffs in sex discrimination cases and provides grants to help colleges and universities fight sexual harassment and assault on campus.

WHO CAN JOIN?
