National AAUW

Our National AAUW organization commissioned three important reports.

1990: Shortchanging Girls, Shortchanging America gave data on existing educational practices that favored boys over girls.

2000: Hostile Hallways gave data on sexual harassment in middle and high schools. It detailed the prevalence of various types of sexual harassment and began a national discussion on bullying. Local school boards and PTAs used it to develop local/state/national policies on harassment and bullying.

2010: Why So Few Women? In Science, Technology, Engineering and Math was hailed as a relevant resource for colleges and universities to increase female student numbers in these fields.
